Redmond High School is located in a northeastern suburb of Seattle, Washington and is one of four comprehensive high schools in the Lake Washington School District, encompassing suburbs of Redmond, Kirkland, Sammamish, and Juanita. The mission of Redmond High School is to provide an appropriately challenging academic experience for each individual; a school environment which values the contributions and aptitudes of each individual; and a system of advocacy and instruction which connects each individual to the greater community and the opportunities waiting there.

Advanced Placement (AP)

Redmond High School offers nineteen Advanced Placement classes. Students may enroll in as many AP classes as their high school schedule will accommodate. While most AP classes are offered every year, several others (such as AP Art History and AP European History) are typically offered every other year. In 2016, RHS students took 847 tests in 24 subject areas with 87% earning a grade of 3 or higher. The average score for the school on AP exams was 3.98. In addition, RHS had 35 AP Scholars, 33 AP Scholars with Honors, 101 AP Scholars with Distinction and 31 National AP Scholars.

Students are allowed to access staff as mentors to self-study for AP classes not offered in the regular curriculum.



Graduation Requirements

Students must have a minimum of 22 credits, which must include the following required courses for the class of 2017:

Graduates must also meet standard on Washington State Assessment Requirements.

One-half credit is granted for satisfactory completion of each course that meets three periods per week for 55 minutes per period and one period per week for 85 minutes, for 18 weeks. A passing grade is a "D".

Rank In Class

All students, regardless of the type of classes taken and/or the number of credits earned, are included in the class rank. All courses that receive a letter grade are used to determine class rank. Class ranking is computed semi-annually and cumulatively. Grades point averages and class ranks are not weighted.

Special Academic Options

Redmond High School is devoted to meeting the needs of its students. Students have a number of options from which to choose. Students can take advantage of Honors courses, Advanced Placement courses, Tech Prep (where students earn community college credit while enrolled in classes they take at Redmond High School), and full or part-time enrollment in Running Start (a dual enrollment program where college courses are taken at local community colleges).
